Social and political challenges faced by Latin American nations from independence to present. Emphasis on foreign relations, revolutionary insurgency, and Latin America's role in the modern world economy.

Learning Outcomes:

Students will:

- Demonstrate advanced knowledge of the people and events that shaped Latin American society between the 19th Century independence movements and the present
- Analyze historical documents relating to evolving political and cultural approaches to modern Latin American history
- Explain their own perspectives about history through writing assignments and classroom discussion

Justification:

These changes reflect the ongoing efforts on the part of the History faculty to address the needs of our students and reflect a more updated, flexible, and realistic definition of courses to align with the best practices of our discipline nationally. The course number allows for the creation of a logical sequencing of upper division Latin American history courses. Furthermore, it reflects the areas of specialization and research interests of new faculty.
