Title: French and Francophone Cinema

Measurable Student Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course students will be able to:

- 1. Analyze the content of French and Francophone films and their related influences
- 2. Discuss orally topics related to French and Francophone films in clear correct French
- 3. Demonstrate an advanced proficiency in French spelling and grammar

SCH Value: 3

Description: This course is a survey of French and Francophone cinema from the earliest productions to the contemporary period. It will analyze the social and historical conditions that gave rise to landmark films. Topics for discussion include the impact of history, politics, literature, class, ethnicity, gender, colonialism, migration on selected films.

Prerequisite: FREN 2312 or equivalent

Justification: The course is designed to strengthen and deepen students' mastery of French by reviewing important French grammar points and presenting new vocabulary. Students will also use French as a tool to develop their critical thinking and analytical writing skills.
