Title: Intermediate Italian I

**Measurable Student Learning Outcomes:** Upon successful completion of this course students will be able to:

- 1. Explain and respond to readings of average difficulty in Italian
- 2. Construct conversational sentences in Italian of average difficulty
- 3. Compose oral presentations and written assignments on specific topics
- 4. Analyze diverse aspects of Italian culture

**SCH Value:** 3

**Description**: Review of grammar introduced in ITAL 1311 and 1312; readings of average difficulty in Italian; practice in conversation and composition.

Prerequisite: ITAL 1312 or equivalent course

**Justification:** As of fall 2015, the only Italian course available is ITAL 1620, a six-hour course for beginners. ITAL 2311 is the first of a two-course sequence at the intermediate level. It is directed at students wishing to further their understanding and mastery of Italian.
