**Title:** Historical Biography

**Measurable Student Outcomes:** Upon successful completion of this course students will be able to:

1. Recognize and recall facts and significant events related to the life of a specific historical figure
2. Explain historical change and continuity connected to the interpretation of the actions and significance of a specific historical figure
3. Analyze primary source material related to the life of a specific historical figure

**SCH Value:** 1-3 (Variable)

**Description:** This course provides an account of a prominent figure's life with the intent of examining that person's historical significance.

**Prerequisite:** None

**Justification:** This course will provide lower-division students with the opportunity to familiarize themselves with prominent persons from a wide range of cultures and time periods in a more in-depth fashion than in a survey class. In addition, the material will be amenable to the "signature" class format and the flexible SCH range will allow it to be taught as a "flexi" class and/or as a 2 hour general elective that bridges the gap between the Core Curriculum SCH and the 120 SCH degree requirements. These scheduling factors, as well as the content, work in favor of the students.
