Title: Sport and US History

Measurable Student Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course students will be able to:

1. Explain the relationship between sport and the historical development of American society and cultural identity
2. Communicate a clear historical argument establishing the relationship between US sport and the changes that have happened to American society over time
3. Analyze primary documents relating to the development and influence of sport in US history

SCH Value: 3

Description: This course frames the development of nineteenth and twentieth century American society and culture in the context of sport. Topics include the socio-economic origins of such sports as baseball, boxing, and football, labor demands and the influence of money in US sport, the conflicts over racial prejudice, exclusion, and integration, and the issues of gender roles and athletics.

Prerequisite: HIST 1301 and 1302

Justification: Students will have the opportunity to develop a more complete understanding of the origins, influence, and power of sport in their society. This course may appeal greatly to students seeking a career in coaching or in sports-related fields such as marketing, management, and events promotion.
