The Concurrent Admission Program at Texas A&M International University affords high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to gain credit for University-level classes early. Students who qualify for this program will get a head start on their University education, easing their transition from high school to college.

What's the Point?

- Fulfill high school credits with college level courses.
- Fulfill requirements for the Distinguished Achievement Program.
- Get a head start on your degree.
- Gain college credit while still in high school.
- Defray the cost of tuition, and fees by applying for the Concurrent Admission Scholarship.

We'll Give You a Lift

Qualified applicants may also apply for a Concurrent Admission Scholarship, which may cover the cost of a three-semester credit hour course. To be considered as a possible candidate for this scholarship, please be sure to complete the Scholarship portion located on your application and take note of the special deadlines and requirements applicable to each semester.

Who Can Apply?

If your grade point average is an 85 or higher, and you have attempted the TASP or are TASP exempt, * you can begin as early as the summer after your Sophomore year! As long as you maintain a passing grade in each course, you may continue to take subsequent courses each semester until you graduate from high school.

* See Office of Admissions for exemptions

How Do I Start?

Complete and sign an application for Concurrent Admission and return it to the Office of Admissions (Killam Library 155).

Ask your high school Counselor to complete and sign the portion of the application that asks for your grade point average (GPA) and class rank.

Submit an official high school Transcript.

Your parents must sign the Parental Permission Statement, provided on the application.

Submit a copy of current high school class schedule.

Which Classes Can I Take?

Once you receive an acceptance letter you may register for your class. Call the Office of Admissions at **326-2200** or ask your counselor about registering at your high school.



Since you probably have many other responsibilities with school, as well as extra-curricular activities, we suggest you register for only one class per semester.

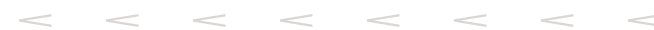
Depending on your TASP scores, you can enroll in a variety of courses that will apply toward your chosen field of study once you graduate.
