1. Be admitted into the University & the College of Education.


2. Fill out the Pre-Registration Advising worksheet for your degree. Browse UConnect to get an idea of the classes in your degree sequence you want to register for.

3. Make sure you have no holds that would affect your registration. Make an appointment to meet with the faculty advisor for your major.

4. On the day of your appointment, bring your pre-registration advising worksheet, a copy of your unofficial transcript, a copy of your DegreeWorks, and a registration form to meet with your advisor.

5. Fill out your registration form entirely! Make sure it has all the needed signatures.

6. Turn your registration form in to the Dean's Office (KL 429). Check your UConnect regularly to ensure your registration was successful.

Admission & Certification

Typical Candidates for this Program:

This program is designed to prepare candidates with educator experience for advances in their careers by adding new specializations within the realm of education to their expertise.

Certifications:

- Candidates will be eligible to complete their certification exam in the final semester of their specialization courses (typically semester 5 of the program).
- Eligibility would be dependent on the candidate's successful completion of all preliminary activities in the certification plan.

Pay:

- The median national salary for Instructional Coordinators for the 2016-2017 school year was \$62K.

What do Instructional Coordinators Do?

Most instructional coordinators work in elementary and secondary schools, colleges, professional schools, educational support services, or for state and local governments. They typically work year round. They oversee school curriculums and teaching standards. They develop instructional material, and work with teachers to implement them effectively.

Job outlook

Graduates of this program can use their qualification to apply for curriculum and instruction leadership positions in their school.

Employment of instructional coordinators (for example) is projected to grow 10 percent from 2016 to 2026, faster than the average for all occupations.
