Overview

The Graduate Record Examinations® (GRE®) tests are taken by individuals applying to graduate schools. This *Bulletin* provides information about GRE tests, policies and procedures for testing, and GRE services and publications.

Tests Offered by the GRE Program

General Test

The General Test is offered as a computer-based test in the U.S., Canada, and many other countries. Paper-based General Test administrations are offered in areas of the world where computer-based testing is not available. The test measures skills that have been developed over a long period of time and are not necessarily related to any particular field of study. See pages 8–9.

Subject Tests

The Subject Tests are offered as paper-based tests and are given in 8 subject areas. The Subject Tests measure achievement in specific subject areas and assume undergraduate majors or extensive background in those disciplines. See pages 10–11.

GRE Fee Waivers

The GRE Board makes available a limited number of GRE fee waivers for college seniors and unenrolled college graduates who meet eligibility requirements. Fee waivers may be used for 1 General Test and/or 1 Subject Test.

To be eligible, you must be

1. a U.S. citizen or resident alien
and
2. a college senior receiving financial aid through an undergraduate college in the U.S., a U.S. territory, or Puerto Rico, or a returning unenrolled college graduate who has applied for financial aid
and either
3. a dependent college senior whose Institutional Student Information Report (ISIR) shows a parental contribution of not more than \$1,200 for the senior year
or
a self-supporting college senior whose ISIR shows a contribution of not more than \$1,600 for the senior year
or
an unenrolled college graduate whose ISIR indicates self-supporting status and a contribution of not more than \$1,600

To apply for a GRE fee waiver

Contact your financial aid office to see if you qualify. Once your eligibility is established, the financial aid office will issue you a fee waiver and a copy of your ISIR.

You must register by mail using either the computer-based or paper-based registration materials. If you are registering for more than one test, all registration materials must be received together with the fee waiver and ISIR or your registration form will be returned to you unprocessed.

Letter requests, photocopies, and faxes of fee waivers will not be accepted. Fee waivers are not retroactive and they cannot be replaced if lost or stolen.

GRE Question-and-Answer Review Service (CBT Verbal and Quantitative Sections)

This service, which is available for \$50, allows you to review the verbal and quantitative test questions that you answered incorrectly on the computer-based General Test you took. General Test Information

Description of the General Test

The General Test measures skills that have been developed over a long period of time and are not necessarily related to any particular field of study. The test is composed of analytical writing, verbal, and quantitative sections.

Analytical Writing Section: 2 Writing Tasks

Present Your Perspective on an Issue
Analyze an Argument

This section tests your critical thinking and analytical writing skills. It assesses your ability to articulate and support complex ideas, analyze an argument, and sustain a focused and coherent discussion. It does not assess specific content knowledge, and there is no single best way to respond. The complete pool of topics for the analytical writing measure is published on the GRE Web site at www.gre.org/pracmats.html.

Verbal Section

This section tests your ability to analyze and evaluate written material and synthesize information obtained from it, analyze relationships among component parts of sentences, and recognize relationships between words and concepts. There is a balance among the passages across different subject matter areas, such as the natural sciences, the social sciences, and the humanities.

Quantitative Section

This section tests your basic mathematical skills and your understanding of elementary mathematical concepts, as well as your ability to reason quantitatively and solve problems in a quantitative setting. There is a balance among the questions requiring arithmetic, algebra, geometry, and data analysis. These are content areas usually studied in high school.

Computer-Based General Test

Analytical Writing Section

The 2 writing tasks are delivered on the computer, and you must word process your responses.

For the **Issue task**, you will be able to choose 1 of 2 essay topics selected by the computer from the pool of topics.

The **Argument task** does not offer a choice of topics; the computer will present you with a single topic selected from the topic pool.

The testing software uses an elementary word processor developed by ETS so that individuals familiar with a specific commercial word processing software do not have an advantage or disadvantage. This software contains the following functionalities: inserting text, deleting text, cut and paste, undoing the previous action, and scrolling. Tools such as a spelling checker and grammar checker are not available in the software, in large part to maintain fairness with those examinees who choose to handwrite their essays.

NOTE: The option to handwrite essay responses is not available at CBT centers. A separate paper-based Analytical Writing Measure is available at the December 2003 Subject Test administration. The fee for this test is \$55 in the U.S., U.S. Territories (includes American Samoa, Guam, and U.S. Virgin Islands only), and Puerto Rico, and \$70 in all other locations. (Note that you cannot take the Analytical Writing Measure and a Subject Test on the same test date.) Call or fax ETS (see page 6) at least 6 weeks prior to the registration deadline for registration instructions. See the back cover for the registration deadline and approximate score report mailing date for the December 2003 Subject Test administration.

Scores on the paper-based Analytical Writing Measure will be sent up to 6 weeks after your test.

Verbal and Quantitative Sections

The verbal and quantitative sections of the General Test are adaptive tests; that is, they are tailored to your performance level and provide precise information about your abilities using fewer test questions than traditional paper-based tests.

At the start of the test, you are presented with test questions of middle difficulty. As you answer each question, the computer scores that question and uses that information, as well as your responses to any preceding questions and information about the test design, to determine which question is presented next. As long as you respond correctly to each question, questions of increased difficulty typically will be presented. When you enter incorrect responses, the computer typically will present you with questions of lesser difficulty. Your next question will be the one that best reflects both your previous performance and the requirements of the test design. This means that different test takers will be given different questions.

Because the computer scores each question before selecting the next one, you must answer each question when it is presented. For this reason, once you answer a question and move on to another, you cannot go back and change your answer. The computer has already incorporated both your answer and the requirements of the test design into its selection of the next question for you.

Each computer-based test section meets preestablished specifications, including the types of questions asked and the subject matter presented. The statistical characteristics of the questions answered correctly and incorrectly, including the difficulty levels, are taken into account in the calculation of scores. Therefore, it is appropriate to compare scores of different test takers even though they received different questions.

ETS has conducted research studies indicating that verbal and quantitative scores on the computer-based General Test are comparable to verbal and quantitative scores earned on the paper-based General Test.

Paper-Based General Test

Analytical Writing Section

In the paper-based General Test, the topics in the analytical writing section will be presented in the test book and you will handwrite your essay responses on the answer sheets provided. Make sure you use the correct answer sheet for each task.

During the actual administration of the General Test, you may work only on the particular writing task the test center supervisor designates and only for the time allowed. You may *not* go back to an earlier section of the test after the supervisor announces, "Please stop work," for that task. The supervisor is authorized to dismiss you from the center for doing so.

Verbal and Quantitative Sections

When taking a verbal or quantitative section of the paper-based General Test, you are free, within any section, to skip questions that you might have difficulty answering and to come back to them later during the time provided to work on that section. You may also change the answer to any question you recorded on the answer sheet by erasing it completely and filling in the oval corresponding to your desired answer for that question.

Each of your scores will be determined by the number of questions for which you select the best answer from the choices given. Questions for which you mark no answer or more than one answer are not counted in scoring. Nothing is subtracted from a score if you answer a question incorrectly.

During the actual administration of the General Test, you may work only on the section the test center supervisor designates and only for the time allowed. You may *not* go back to an earlier section of the test after the supervisor announces, "Please stop work" for that section. The supervisor is authorized to dismiss you from the center for doing so. All answers must be recorded on your answer sheet. Answers recorded in your test booklet will not be counted.

Some questions on the General Test have only 4 response options (A through D). All GRE answer sheets for the paper-based test contain response positions for 5 responses (A through E). Therefore, if an E response is marked for a 4-option question, it will be ignored. An E response for a 4-option question is treated the same as no response (omitted).

Modified Versions of Verbal and Quantitative Questions

The test you take may include questions that are modified versions of published questions or of questions you have already seen on an earlier section of the test. Some modifications are substantial; others are less apparent. Thus, even if a question appears to be similar to a question you have already seen, it may in fact be a different question and may also have a different correct answer. You can be assured of doing your best on the test you take by paying careful attention to the wording of each question as it appears in your test.

The GRE Program is currently investigating the feasibility of reusing questions that have been published in GRE practice materials. As part of that investigation, you may see questions from these materials on the test you take.

Preparing for the General Test

A CD-ROM containing *GRE POWERPREP* software will be sent free of charge to each individual who registers for the **computer-based GRE General Test**. A free downloadable version of the software is also available from the GRE Web site at www.gre.org/pracmats.html. The software includes test tutorials; practice questions with explanations; a Math Review describing the content of the quantitative section in detail; 2 actual computer-adaptive tests for the verbal and quantitative sections; and 2 timed tests for the analytical writing section, with sample topics, essay responses, and reader commentary. The software lets you practice writing essays under simulated GRE testing conditions, with the same GRE word processing and testing tools that appear on the test. The Math Review is also available on the GRE Web site at www.gre.org/pracmats.html.

A *GRE Practice General Test* will be sent free of charge to each individual who registers for a **paper-based General Test**. A free downloadable version of the practice book is also available from the GRE Web site at www.gre.org/pracmats.html. The practice book contains one full-length paper-based General Test; test-taking strategies; sample analytical writing topics, scored sample essays, and reader commentary; and sample verbal and quantitative questions and explanations.

In addition, you can view information about the analytical writing section and test-taking strategies on the GRE Web site at www.gre.org/pracmats.html. The materials available include information about the nature of the test; directions for the 2 essay tasks; the entire pool of topics and scoring criteria for each task; and score descriptions for each reported score level.

GRE POWERPREP is only IBM- or PC-compatible. The software is *not* compatible with Apple Macintosh computers. *POWERPREP* was developed using the same software that is used to administer the General Test at computer-based test centers, which is a PC environment.

Subject Test Information

Brief descriptions of the content of the 8 Subject Tests are presented below. When you register for a Subject Test, you will be sent a free practice book that describes the test in more detail, includes a full-length test and answer key, and provides information to help you understand the scores you earn. The free practice books are also available in downloadable format on the GRE Web site at www.gre.org/pracmats.html.

Subject Test Descriptions

BIOCHEMISTRY, CELL AND MOLECULAR BIOLOGY TEST

This test consists of about 180 questions and is intended for students who are interested in graduate programs in biochemistry, cell biology, and molecular biology, along with related programs such as microbiology and genetics. The questions are distributed among 3 subscore areas: Biochemistry (36%), Cell Biology (28%), and Molecular Biology and Genetics (36%).

- Biochemistry**
Chemical and physical foundations; biomolecules: structure, assembly, organization, and dynamics; catalysis and binding; major metabolic pathways; bioenergetics; regulation and integration of metabolism; methodology
- Cell Biology**
Cellular compartments of prokaryotes and eukaryotes; cell surface and communication; cytoskeleton, motility, and shape; protein synthesis and processing; cell division, differentiation, and development
- Molecular Biology and Genetics**
Genetic foundations; chromatin and chromosomes; genomics; genome maintenance; gene expression; gene regulation in prokaryotes and eukaryotes; bacteriophages, animal and plant viruses; methodology

BIOLOGY TEST

The test contains approximately 200 questions that are about equally divided among 3 subscore areas:

- Cellular and Molecular Biology**
Cellular Structure and Function: biological compounds; enzyme activity; metabolic pathways and regulation; membrane dynamics and cell surfaces; organelles; cytoskeleton, motility, and shape; cell cycle
Genetics and Molecular Biology: genetic foundations; chromatin and chromosomal structure; genomic organization and maintenance; gene expression and regulation; immuno-biology; viruses; recombinant DNA methodology
- Organismal Biology:**
Animal and plant structure, function, organization, reproduction, growth, and development; characteristics and phylogenetic relationships of organisms in the Archaeobacteria, Eubacteria, Protista, Fungi, Plantae, and Animalia
- Ecology and Evolution**
Ecology: environment/organism interaction; behavioral ecology; population structure and function; communities; ecosystems
Evolution: genetic variability; evolutionary processes, e.g., natural selection, genetic drift; evolutionary consequences, e.g., fitness and adaptation, speciation; history of life

CHEMISTRY TEST

The test contains about 136 questions designed to cover much of the content of the chemistry courses completed by students before the middle of the senior collegiate year. The questions are classified approximately as follows: analytical chemistry (15%), inorganic chemistry (25%), organic chemistry (30%), and physical chemistry (30%).

Topics covered may include:

- Analytical Chemistry**
Data acquisition and statistics; concentration terms and standardization of solutions; homogeneous and heterogeneous equilibrium; instrumental methods; environmental applications; radiochemical methods

- Inorganic Chemistry**
General chemistry; acid-base concepts; structure and bonding in ionic, covalent, and metallic substances; chemistry and physical properties of the main group and transition elements; special topics such as solid-state, bioinorganic, and organometallic chemistry
- Organic Chemistry**
Functional group conversions; reaction mechanisms; molecular structure and spectroscopy; special topics such as organometallic, environmental, biorganic, and polymer chemistry, and synthesis problems
- Physical Chemistry**
Thermodynamics; kinetic theory of gases, and statistical mechanics; quantum chemistry and molecular spectroscopy; kinetics, solution and liquid dynamics, and photochemistry

COMPUTER SCIENCE TEST

This test consists of about 70 questions and is intended for students who plan to seek a graduate degree in computer science and who have taken courses in computer science at least to the level of an undergraduate major in computer science. The questions are classified approximately as follows: software systems and methodology (40%), computer organization and architecture (15%), theory and mathematical background (40%), and other topics, such as artificial intelligence, modeling, and simulation (5%).

Topics covered may include:

- Software Systems and Methodology**
Data organization; program control; programming languages and notation; software engineering; systems
- Computer Organization and Architecture**
Digital logic design; processors and control units; memories and their hierarchies; networking and communication; high-performance architectures
- Theory and Mathematical Background**
Algorithms and complexity; automata and language theory; discrete structures
- Other Topics**

Subject Test Information *(continued)*

LITERATURE IN ENGLISH TEST

The test contains approximately 230 questions on literature in English from the British Isles, the United States, and other countries. It also contains a few questions on major works, including the Bible, in translation. Factual questions test a student's knowledge of writers typically studied in college courses; for example, a student may be asked to identify a writer or work described in a brief critical comment or represented in a short excerpt. Interpretive questions test a student's ability to read passages of poetry, drama, fiction, and nonfiction prose perceptively; such questions may address meaning, use of language, form and structure, literary techniques, and various aspects of style.

The questions are classified approximately as follows: literary analysis (40–55%), identification (15–20%), cultural and historical contexts (20–25%), history and theory of literary criticism (10–15%). In addition, the literary-historical scope of the test follows the distribution below.

1. Continental, Classical, and Comparative Literature through 1925 (5–10%)
2. British Literature to 1660, including Milton (25–30%)
3. British Literature 1660–1925 (30–35%)
4. American Literature through 1925 (15–25%)
5. American, British, and World Literatures after 1925 (20–25%)

MATHEMATICS TEST (Rescaled)*

The test consists of about 66 questions and is intended to measure both the knowledge of the content of undergraduate mathematics courses for mathematics majors and the mathematical abilities traditionally expected of anyone who intends to seek a graduate degree in mathematics. In addition to the usual sequence of elementary calculus courses, the examinee should have had the mathematics-major courses in abstract algebra, linear algebra, and real analysis that require students to demonstrate the ability to prove theorems and create

counterexamples. About a quarter of the questions require knowledge in other areas, as listed in Other Topics below.

The questions are classified approximately as follows:

1. **Calculus (50%)**
Differential and integral calculus of one and of several variables, including calculus-based applications and connections with coordinate geometry, trigonometry, differential equations, and other branches of mathematics
2. **Algebra (25%)**
Elementary algebra, linear algebra, abstract algebra, and number theory
3. **Other Topics (25%)**
Introductory real analysis, discrete mathematics (including logic, set theory, combinatorics, graph theory, algorithms), general topology, geometry, complex variables, probability and statistics, and numerical analysis

***Note:** The Mathematics Test was rescaled effective October 2001 and renamed "Mathematics Test (Rescaled)." Scores earned on the Mathematics Test (Rescaled) after October 2001 should not be compared to scores earned before that date. Additional information about the rescaled test is available on the GRE Web site and is also included in the score interpretive leaflet that accompanies score reports.

PHYSICS TEST

The test consists of approximately 100 questions, most of which relate to the first 3 years of undergraduate physics. Topics include classical mechanics (20%), fundamentals of electromagnetism (18%), atomic physics (10%), physical optics and wave phenomena (9%), quantum mechanics (12%), thermodynamics and statistical mechanics (10%), special relativity (6%), and laboratory methods (6%). The remaining 9% of the test covers advanced topics such as nuclear and particle physics, condensed matter physics, and astrophysics.

PSYCHOLOGY TEST

The test has approximately 210 questions drawn from courses most commonly offered at the undergraduate level, in 3 categories:

1. **Experimental or natural science** (about 40% of the questions), including learning, language, memory, thinking, sensation and perception, physiological psychology, and ethology
2. **Social or social science** (about 43% of the questions), including clinical and abnormal, developmental, personality, and social psychology
3. **General** (about 17% of the questions), including the history of psychology, applied psychology, measurement, research designs, and statistics

The test's total score includes the questions in all 3 categories. The test has 2 subscores: an experimental psychology subscore consisting of category 1 questions only and a social psychology subscore consisting of category 2 questions only.

Preparing for a Subject Test

A GRE Subject Test practice book will be sent free of charge to each individual who registers for a Subject Test. A free downloadable version of the practice book is also available from the GRE Web site at www.gre.org/pracmats.html. The practice book contains one full-length Subject Test and test-taking strategies.

Policies and Procedures

Identification (ID) Requirements for Computer-Based and Paper-Based Tests

All test takers **must read Part 1**. Depending on whether you will be testing within your country of citizenship or outside of it, see Part 2 or Part 3 for information on acceptable and valid ID.

All test takers in Bangladesh, India, and Pakistan **MUST** use valid passports as their ID documents.

PART 1—Information for ALL Test Takers

- You must have acceptable and valid ID to be admitted to a test center. Identification requirements are strictly enforced. It is your responsibility to read and understand the instructions and requirements.
- If you arrive at the test center without the required identification, the test center administrator will not admit you, you cannot test, and you will forfeit your test fee.
- **When scheduling your appointment, you must use exactly the same name as shown on the primary identification document that you will present at the test center.** If the name shown on your primary identification does not match the name on your appointment record, you will not be permitted to test.
- **Only misspellings of your name can be corrected at check-in—NAME CHANGES WILL NOT BE MADE.** If your name has changed for any reason, including marriage, you still must present primary identification in the name under which you made the appointment, or you will not be permitted to test.
- If the test center administrator questions the ID you present, you will be required to present additional proof of identity. If positive confirmation cannot be made, you may be refused admission to the test center.
- Test center personnel will check your identification before assigning you a seat at the test center. You will be asked to sign the test center log. The administrator will check your signature to verify that you are the person in your photo identification. The administrator will repeat this procedure before and after all breaks.

- Admittance to the test center does not imply that your form of identification is valid or that your scores will be reported. All reported cases of questionable identification are subject to review and approval by the ETS Test Security Office.

Supplemental Identification Documents

If your primary identification, specified in **Part 2** or **Part 3**, is missing either a **photo** or a **signature**, you must present one of the following *supplemental IDs* in addition to your primary ID. Supplemental IDs that can be used to meet the photograph and/or signature requirements are:

- a government-issued identification document that has not expired (including but not limited to passport, driver's license, national identification, or military identification). There are some exceptions: see Unacceptable Identification Documents.
- student ID
- confirmation of identity letter from your educational institution

The letter must contain your date of birth, a recent, recognizable photograph, your signature, and the date issued.

It must be typed on the original letterhead of the educational institution you attend(ed), and the signature of the school official and the school seal must overlap your photograph. A letter of identity is valid for only one year after the date issued.

Unacceptable Identification Documents

- any expired ID
- international driver's license
- Social Security card
- draft classification card
- credit card of any kind
- notary-prepared letter or document
- employee identification card

If You Cannot Meet the Specified ID Requirements or if You Have Questions About ID, you must contact the ETS Test Security Office (1-609-406-5430, fax: 1-609-406-9709, or e-mail: TSReturns@ets.org) before you schedule an appointment to test.

PART 2—ID for Testing WITHIN Your Country of Citizenship

You must present **ONE** of the following *primary identification documents*:

- **passport** with photograph and signature
- **driver's license** with photograph and signature
- **national identification** with photograph and signature
- **military identification** with photograph and signature

If your primary ID does not contain your signature, you must either sign the document or present an additional ID from the list of *supplemental identification documents* (see Part 1). The supplemental ID must contain a recent, recognizable photograph and your signature.

PART 3—ID for Testing OUTSIDE Your Country of Citizenship

You **MUST PRESENT YOUR PASSPORT** as your *primary identification document* (citizens of European and Schengen Treaty countries see special requirements below). If you do not meet this requirement, ETS may automatically cancel your test scores.

If your passport is **not written in English language letters**, you must also present an additional ID from the list of *supplemental identification documents* (see Part 1) that contains a recent, recognizable photo and is in English.

If your passport **does not contain your signature**, you must either sign your passport or present an additional ID from the list of *supplemental identification documents*.

U.S. military personnel may present their U.S. military ID cards for admission to test centers.

European Union/Schengen Zone Countries

If you are taking the test within a European Union or Schengen Zone Country, you may use your valid national or European identity card if you have one. The card you present must contain a recent, recognizable **photograph**, your **date of birth**, and your **signature**. If your form of identification is not in English language letters and the test administrator cannot read the language in which it is written, you may not be allowed to test. If your official ID **does not contain your signature**, you must present an additional document from the list of *supplemental identification documents* (see Part 1) that does contain your signature.

Test Center Procedures and Regulations

For Both Computer-Based and Paper-Based Tests

- The test will be given on the day and at the time scheduled.
- You will be assigned a seat.
- Testing aids are not permitted at the testing center. These include but are not limited to mechanical pencils, pens, pagers, beepers, calculators, watch calculators, books, pamphlets, notes, rulers, highlighter pens, stereos or radios with headphones, telephones, cell phones, watch alarms (including those with flashing lights or alarm sounds), stop watches, dictionaries, translators, and any electronic or photographic devices.
- You may not eat, drink, or use tobacco during testing time.
- Dress in such a way that you can adapt to any room temperature.
- ID verification at the test center may include thumbprinting, photographing, videotaping, or other form of electronic ID confirmation. If you refuse to participate, you will not be permitted to test and you will forfeit your test fee. This is in addition to the requirement that you must present acceptable and valid identification.
- You may not communicate with anyone about the content of the test while the test session is in progress, during breaks, or after the test.
- You will not be permitted to leave the test center vicinity during the test session or during breaks.
- Access to telephones and personal items, such as cell phones, briefcases, and study materials, will not be permitted during the test session or during breaks.
- Removing or attempting to remove test content from the test center is prohibited. Under no circumstances may test content or any part of the test content be removed, reproduced, and/or disclosed by any means (e.g., hard copy, verbally, electronically) to any person or entity.

For Computer-Based Tests Only

The following procedures and regulations apply during the entire test session, which begins at sign-in, ends at sign-out, and includes breaks.

- Report to the test center at least 30 minutes before your scheduled appointment for check-in procedures.

If you arrive late, you may not be admitted and your fee will not be refunded.

- If you requested and received an authorization voucher from ETS, you must take it with you to the test center.
- You will be required to write and sign a confidentiality statement at the test center. If you do not complete and sign the statement, you cannot test and your fees will NOT be refunded.
- Other than ID, personal items are not allowed in the testing room. Before the test, you will be assigned a locker where you can deposit items such as telephones, pagers, handbags, and study materials. You may also be asked to empty your pockets. Storage space is small, so plan accordingly. You may not have access to your locker during the test or break.
- Test centers assume no responsibility for candidates' personal belongings.
- Test centers do not have large waiting areas. Friends or relatives who accompany you to the test center will not be permitted to wait in the test center or be in contact with you while you are taking the test.
- You will be required to sign the test center log before and after the test session and any time you leave or enter the testing room.
- The administrator will provide you with 6 sheets of scratch paper that may be replaced after you have used all 6 pieces. You may not take your own scratch paper to the test, nor may you remove scratch paper from the testing room at any time.
- The General Test includes an optional 10-minute break after the analytical writing section. This break time cannot be exceeded.
- If you need to leave your seat at any time other than the break, raise your hand; timing of the section will not stop.
- Repeated unscheduled breaks will be documented and reported to ETS.
- If at any time during the test you have a problem with your computer, or for any reason need the administrator, raise your hand.
- Testing premises are subject to videotaping.
- On occasion, weather conditions or other circumstances beyond the test administrator's or ETS's control may require a delayed start or the rescheduling of your test appointment. In the

event that a *technical* problem at the test center makes it necessary to cancel your test session, or if it is later determined that your scores could not be reported, you will be offered the opportunity to schedule another test appointment free of charge or receive a full refund of the original test fee. In addition, you may seek reimbursement from ETS for reasonable and documented expenses associated with traveling to the test center, even though technical problems are generally not the fault of ETS. To request reimbursement, please contact us (see page 6) with the following information within 30 days of your original appointment: your name, date of birth, mailing address, daytime telephone number, e-mail address, original test date and appointment number, and a brief description of what occurred at the test center. All reimbursements will be made in U.S. dollars.

For Paper-Based Tests Only

- Supervisors will not honor requests for schedule changes.
- Take your admission ticket and photo ID to the test center.
- Take 3 or 4 sharpened soft-lead (No. 2 or HB) pencils and a good eraser. Pencils and erasers will not be supplied at the center.
- No test taker will be admitted after test materials have been distributed.
- Paper of any kind is not permitted in the testing room.
- You must have the supervisor's permission to leave the room during the test. Any time lost cannot be made up.
- You may wish to pace yourself with your own watch, but the supervisor is the official timekeeper. You will not be permitted to continue the test or any part of it beyond the established time limit. *Watch alarms are not permitted.*
- Answers to multiple-choice questions recorded in the test book will not be scored. You may use the test book to work out your answers, but you must mark *all* your answers on the separate answer sheet before time is called.
- Except for ETS-authorized observers, visitors are not allowed in the testing room while testing is in progress.
- At the conclusion of the test you will be required to return your test book and answer sheet to the test supervisor. These materials are the property of ETS.

Policies and Procedures *(continued)*

Dismissal from a Test Center

The test center administrator/supervisor is authorized to dismiss you from a test session or ETS may cancel your scores for any of the following:

- attempting to take the test for someone else
- failing to provide acceptable identification
- obtaining improper access to the test, a part of the test, or information about the test
- using notes or any prohibited aid in connection with the test
- creating a disturbance (disruptive behavior in any form will not be tolerated; the test administrator/supervisor has sole discretion in determining what constitutes disruptive behavior)
- attempting to give or receive assistance—or otherwise communicate in any manner with another person about the test during the administration
- attempting to remove scratch paper from the computer-based testing room
- exceeding time permitted for a scheduled break
- using paper of any kind during a paper-based test administration
- referring to, looking through, or working on any test, or test section, *when not authorized to do so*, or marking your answer sheet after time has been called
- taking food or drink into the testing room
- leaving the testing room or test center vicinity without permission
- removing or attempting to remove a test book, test questions, or portion of a test in any format from the testing room
- attempting to tamper with a computer

- failing to follow any of the test administration regulations contained in this *Bulletin*, given by the test administrator/supervisor, or specified in any test materials

ETS reserves the right to take all action—including, but not limited to, barring you from future testing and/or canceling your scores—for failure to comply with test administration regulations or the test administrator/supervisor's directions. If your scores are canceled, they will not be reported, and your fees will not be refunded.

Although tests are administered under strict supervision and security measures, testing irregularities may sometimes occur. Please contact us as soon as possible to report any observed behavior that may lead to an invalid score—for example, someone copying from another test taker, taking a test for someone else, having access to test questions before the exam, or using notes or unauthorized aids. All information will be held in strictest confidence.

Paper-Based Test Registration

Monday Testing

Monday testing will be arranged only for those whose religious convictions prevent them from testing on Saturday. Mail your registration form, fees, and letter—signed by your cleric on letterhead stationery—confirming your

affiliation with a recognized religious body that observes its Sabbath on Saturday. Your request must be received by the special registration deadline on the back cover. Leave the code number blank in Item 6 on your registration form, but indicate the city and state where you wish to test. You will be assigned to the closest available center within 125 miles for locations that are scheduled for Saturday test dates. No standby testing is permitted.

Supplementary Test Centers

If you are more than 125 miles from the nearest center scheduled to give the paper-based General Test on October 25, 2003, or the Subject Tests on November 8, 2003, you may request a supplementary center. Your request must (1) accompany your completed registration form and fees (leave Item 6 blank); (2) be received by the special registration deadline on the back cover; (3) include the name and complete address of an institution and staff member willing to administer the test; (4) indicate if you would prefer another test date at a center listed in the *Bulletin* or a refund since centers cannot be guaranteed; and (5) explain why the centers on pages 24–29 are not suitable.

Changing Your Test or Test Center

If you wish to change your center or the test for which you have registered, call the GRE Program (see page 6) prior to the test date or report to the preferred test center on the test day with your original admission ticket. If the test center can accommodate you and the test you need is available, there is no additional charge.

Scores and Score Reports

New General Test

Three scores are reported:

- a verbal score reported on a 200–800 score scale, in 10-point increments,
- a quantitative score reported on a 200–800 score scale, in 10-point increments, and
- an analytical writing score reported on a 0–6 score scale, in half-point increments.

Note: Beginning in the fall of 2003, essay responses on the analytical writing section of the General Test will be made available to designated score recipients. If you test on or after July 1, 2003, your essay responses from your current and previous General Test administrations will be made available as part of your cumulative score record.

Scoring Processes for Adaptive and Paper-Based Tests

The processes for calculating reported scores for adaptive tests and traditional paper-based tests are similar, in that the number of questions answered correctly is adjusted according to the difficulty level of the questions on the test form. Thus, the same number of correct responses on different test forms will not necessarily result in the same reported score.

In paper-based tests, the differences in difficulty among test forms are relatively small and are adjusted through a process known as score equating. The number of questions answered is also figured into the calculation of the reported score because it limits the number that can be answered correctly.

With adaptive testing, an examinee is administered a set of questions with a difficulty level that is specifically designed to match the examinee's ability level. The mathematical process for calculating a score in this situation incorporates the statistical properties of the questions, the examinee's performance on the questions, and the number of questions that are answered.

Scoring Processes for the General Test

Analytical Writing Section

A single score is reported for the analytical writing section. Each essay receives a score from 2 trained readers using a 6-point holistic scale. In holistic scoring, readers are trained to assign scores on the basis

of the overall quality of a response to the assigned task. If the 2 assigned scores differ by more than 1 point on the scale, the discrepancy is adjudicated by a third, very experienced, reader. Otherwise, the scores from the 2 readings of an essay are averaged. The final scores on the 2 essays are then averaged and rounded up to the nearest half-point interval (e.g., 3.0, 3.5). If no essay response is given for either of the 2 tasks in this section, an NS (No Score) is reported for the section. If an essay response is provided for only 1 of the 2 writing tasks, the task for which no essay response is provided will receive a score of zero.

The primary emphasis in scoring the analytical writing section is on your critical thinking and analytical writing skills rather than on grammar and mechanics. (Scoring guides for each essay task are available on the GRE Web site at www.gre.org/pracmats.html.) Additional scoring information is provided in the POWERPREP software, the Practice General Test, and in the interpretive leaflet enclosed with your score report.

During the scoring process, your essay responses on the analytical writing section will be reviewed by ETS essay-similarity-detection software and by experienced essay readers. See **Plagiarism** under "Cancellation of Scores by ETS" on page 17.

Verbal and Quantitative Sections

You will receive test scores for the verbal and quantitative sections (except unidentified pretest sections and/or research sections), regardless of the number of questions answered, even if time expires before you answer all the questions. However, if you answer no questions at all in a section, that section will be reported as a No Score (NS).

Computer-Based Test. Your verbal and quantitative scores will depend on your performance on the questions presented and on the number of questions you answer in the time allotted. Because both of these sections are computer adaptive, the questions are selected to reflect your performance on preceding questions and the requirements of the test design. Test design factors that influence which questions are presented include (1) the statistical characteristics (including difficulty level) of the questions already answered, (2) the required variety of question types, and (3) the appropriate coverage of content. Additional scoring information is provided in the

POWERPREP software and in the interpretive leaflet enclosed with your score report.

Paper-Based Test. Scoring of the verbal and quantitative sections of the paper-based General Test is essentially a two-step process. First, a raw score is computed. The raw score is the number of questions for which the best answer choice was given. The raw score is then converted to a scaled score through a process known as equating. The equating process accounts for differences in difficulty among the different test editions; thus, a given scaled score reflects approximately the same level of ability regardless of the edition of the test that was taken. Additional scoring information is provided in the Practice General Test and in the interpretive leaflet enclosed with your score report.

Scoring Process for the Subject Tests

The scoring of Subject Tests is essentially a 2-step process. First, a raw score is computed. The raw score for a Subject Test is the number of multiple-choice questions you answered correctly minus one-fourth the number of questions you answered incorrectly. Second, so that individual scores can be compared to one another, each raw score is converted to a scaled score through an equating process. The equating process takes into account the differences in difficulty among the different test editions. As a result, for each individual Subject Test, a given scaled score reflects approximately the same level of ability regardless of the edition of the test that was taken.

Rescoring the Analytical Writing Measure

Test takers may request rescoring of their analytical writing section up to 6 months after the administration. Submit a \$45 fee with your written request; include your full name, date of birth, test date, registration number, address, and phone number. Mail the request to the "General Inquiries" address on page 6. If your score increases or decreases, the new score will be reported.

Paper-Based Test Hand Scoring

Hand scoring for a Subject Test or for the verbal and quantitative sections of the paper-based General Test is available up to 6 months after the administration. Submit a \$30 fee with your written request;

include your full name, date of birth, test date, registration number, address, and phone number. Mail the request to the “General Inquiries” address on page 6. If your scores increase or decrease, the new score(s) will be reported.

Reporting Your Computer-Based General Test Scores

You will receive unofficial verbal and quantitative scores at the test center; however, because of the essay scoring process, you will not receive your analytical writing score at that time. Official verbal, quantitative, and analytical writing scores will be sent to you and score recipients within 10 to 15 days after you take the test.

At the testing center, you may request that scores be sent to as many as 4 graduate institutions or fellowships at no additional charge. If you do not select institutions on the test day, you must pay \$15 per institution to have scores sent at a later date.

If an institution is not listed, ask the test center administrator for the appropriate form to indicate unlisted institutions. Complete the form and turn it in *before* you leave the test center. The form will not be accepted after you leave the test center.

Test centers cannot provide printed copies of score reports.

Reporting Your Paper-Based General Test or Subject Test Scores

Within 4 to 6 weeks after you take the test, score reports are mailed to you and up to 4 institutions designated at the time of registration or on the admission ticket correction stub. See the back cover of this *Bulletin* for approximate score report mailing dates.

Cumulative Reporting

GRE score reporting is cumulative. Current GRE Board policy states that your scores are reportable for 5 years. Your scores are retained for the 5 testing years following the testing year in which you tested. All scores earned during this time will be reported to each institution you designate. You may choose to send only General Test scores, only Subject Test scores, only Analytical Writing or Writing Assessment scores, or any combination of the above, but you may not choose to have only those scores from a specific test date reported. Your score report will indicate

your designated recipients and your cumulative record reported at that time. However, your designated recipients will not receive information concerning the other score recipients you have chosen.

Obtaining Older Scores

Prior to October 1985, GRE Board policy stated that scores would be reported for 20 years. If you tested between October 1, 1983, and September 30, 1985, you can still request that those scores be sent along with the most recent interpretive data. (**Note:** Since the interpretive data are composed of recent test takers, the percentile ranking of an individual’s score may have changed between the time they took the test and the present.) A notice will be included with those reports indicating that older scores should be interpreted with caution.

There is no additional charge for reporting older scores to institutions listed on a current registration form if you enclose a completed Additional Score Report (ASR) Request Form and indicate your earlier test date. If you have changed your name since you tested, be sure to indicate the name under which you tested. If you submit a separate ASR form at a later date, the appropriate fee must be included.

Absence from a Paper-Based Testing Session

Institutions will not receive any information about your absence or about any previous scores you may have on file.

Preventing Unauthorized Release of Your Scores

It is a GRE Board policy that your scores be reported only to you, to accredited institutions of higher education granting the baccalaureate or higher degrees, and to approved graduate fellowship-granting sponsors.

Score reports will be released only upon your request. ETS will not release your scores at the request of institutions or fellowship sponsors except for use in research studies that are approved by the GRE Board and that provide anonymity for the test takers and the institutions they attend.

Note: Your score record and the documents you completed that are retained at ETS may be released to third parties, e.g., government agencies, parties to a lawsuit, if requested pursuant to a subpoena.

Test Takers’ Performance Data

Test takers’ performance data may be used in analysis samples, score interpretation data, group statistics, and research studies. Test takers’ essay responses may be used in ETS materials to train scorers, to help score recipients interpret scores, or to help examinees prepare for the test. In each instance, all identifying information will be removed.

ETS Review of Test Questions

In keeping with its commitment to prepare high-quality tests, ETS routinely follows extensive review and quality control procedures to detect and avoid flawed questions and consequent errors in scoring. Such procedures include independent reviews by qualified individuals, pretesting questions for the General Test, feedback from test takers after they have taken a GRE test, and careful analysis of performance data on each question after it has been administered in a GRE test.

Nonetheless, occasionally an error may be discovered after scores have been reported. Whenever this happens, the specific circumstances are reviewed carefully, and a decision is made about how best to take corrective action that is the most fair to all concerned.

Cancellation of Scores by ETS

Test Security Issues

Educational Testing Service strives to report scores that accurately reflect the performance of every test taker. Accordingly, ETS’s standards and procedures for administering tests have 2 primary goals: giving test takers equivalent opportunities to demonstrate their abilities, and preventing any test takers from gaining an unfair advantage over others. To promote these objectives, ETS reserves the right to cancel any test score when, in ETS’s judgment, a **testing irregularity** occurs, there is an apparent **discrepancy in a test taker’s identification**, the test taker engages in **misconduct** or **plagiarism**, or the score is **invalid** for another reason. Reviews of scores by ETS are confidential. When, for any of the above reasons, ETS cancels a test score that has already been reported, it notifies score recipients that the score has been canceled, but it does not disclose the reason for cancellation except when authorized to do so by the test taker, and in certain group cases.

Scores and Score Reports *(continued)*

Testing Irregularities. “Testing irregularities” refers to problems with the administration of a test. When testing irregularities occur, they may affect an individual or groups of test takers. Such problems include, without limitation, administrative errors (such as improper timing, improper seating, defective materials, and defective equipment); improper access to test content; and other disruptions of test administrations (such as natural disasters or other emergencies). When testing irregularities occur, ETS may decline to score the test, or cancel the test score. When, in ETS’s judgment it is appropriate to do so, ETS gives affected test takers the opportunity to take the test again as soon as possible without charge.

Identification Discrepancies. When, in ETS’s judgment, or the judgment of test center personnel, there is a discrepancy in a test taker’s identification, the test taker may be dismissed from the test center. In addition, ETS may decline to score the test or cancel the test score.

Misconduct. When ETS or test center personnel find that there is misconduct in connection with a test, the test taker may be dismissed from the test center, or ETS may decline to score the test, or cancel the test score. Misconduct includes, but is not limited to, non-compliance with the “Test Center Procedures and Regulations” found on pages 13–14 of this *Bulletin*.

Plagiarism. Your essay responses on the analytical writing section will be reviewed by ETS essay-similarity-detection software and by experienced essay readers during the scoring process. Based on widely accepted criteria of plagiarism within United States graduate schools and universities, ETS reserves the right to cancel test scores of any test taker when there is substantial evidence that an essay response includes, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- text that is substantially similar to that found in one or more other GRE essay responses;
- quoting or paraphrasing, without attribution, language or ideas that appear in published or unpublished sources;

- unacknowledged use of work that has been produced through collaboration with others without citation of the contribution of others;
- essays that are submitted as work of the examinee when the ideas or words have, in fact, been borrowed from elsewhere or prepared by another person.

When one or more of the above circumstances occurs, your essay text, in ETS’s professional judgment, does not reflect the independent, analytical writing skills that this test seeks to measure. Therefore, ETS must cancel the essay score as invalid and cannot report the GRE General Test scores of which the essay score is an indispensable part.

Test takers whose scores are canceled will forfeit their test fees and must pay to take the entire GRE General Test again at a future administration. No record of score cancellations, or the reason for cancellation, will appear on their future score reports sent to colleges and universities.

Invalid Scores. ETS may also cancel scores if, in its judgment, there is substantial evidence that they are invalid for any other reason. Evidence of invalid scores may include, without limitation, discrepant handwriting, unusual answer patterns, and inconsistent performance on different parts of the test. Before canceling scores pursuant to this paragraph, ETS notifies the test taker in writing about its concerns, gives the test taker an opportunity to submit information that addresses ETS’s concerns, considers any such information submitted, and offers the test taker a choice of options. The options include voluntary score cancellation, a free retest, or arbitration in accordance with ETS’s standard Arbitration Agreement. In addition, the test taker is sent a copy of a booklet, *Why and How Educational Testing Service Questions Test Scores*, which explains this process in greater detail. (This booklet is available to any test taker at any time on request.)

Note: The retest option is not available outside the United States and Canada. The arbitration option is available only for tests administered in the United States.

Test Fairness and Score Use

ETS and the GRE Program have taken steps to ensure, to the extent possible, that tests and test scores are fair for all test takers, regardless of group membership. In addition, the GRE Board has developed guidelines for the use of GRE scores, which summarize the considerations for appropriate use of the scores and encourage institutions to use GRE scores appropriately. For information about test fairness and appropriate use of GRE scores, visit the GRE Web site at www.gre.org/edupubs.html or contact the GRE Program (see page 6).
