VI. Other Updates

a. Colleen Harris: There are 5 librarian vacancies. We have 2 active searches and there should be a short list soon. We have been approved for a search firm that searches for faculty level librarians.

- b. Adaberto Gonzalez SGA update: We are going May 21st to the CSAC (Chancellors Student Advisory Council) Symposium. Members from the A&M System can address issues with chancellor. Last year was great ;we ended up with three main proposals: The CSAC exchange program to have members from each university go other universities to exchange ideas, a TRIO grant support and implementing it widely, and the AI and OER adaptation support. In other universities they have a Blackboard AI tool where you can ask questions about your syllabus, readings, professor etc. We would like to implement this in other universities. We are trying to push these proposals and on May 21st we will go to RELLIS campus so if there is anything you want to address, please email me.
- c. Rosalinda Dusty camp dates are on the agenda, there will be invites for faculty to come and join for lunch and dinner; The bridge services fee for health and counseling services is available for students enrolled in summer. There are free STD testing services for our students through the health center. Pillar is providing follow up services and this is available during the summer as well
- d. Dr. Gill: The COED rubric passed vote at the last faculty senate meeting. We have selected a DTY, OTY, and DSY and they will be named and congratulated at the Faculty Assembly. There are newly voted in faculty senate executive positions as a result of the elections. I was named Faculty Senate President, Jim Norris was named Faculty Senate Vice President, and Malynda Dalton was named Parliamentarian. We are also working with the provost to discuss the Study Abroad Guidelines.
- e. Mayra Hernandez: We have finalized the summer camp program, and we want to say thank you to the President's office that contributes to this initiative. We have 30 employees that will benefit from this scholarship. We have recognized our staff and the scholarship for employees who are enrolled in the university or A&M system to support them for academic purposes. We have the Bowlathon June 5th at Pla-Mor Entertainment and if you want to sponsor a team, please encourage them to participate. There will be refreshments, pizza, and wings which is a part of the package deal available this year. We highly encourage everyone to attend. We will have the EC minutes posted on our agenda, and we have our suggestion box. We are promoting our healthy U initiative, and to make sure our agenda has all the incentive programs like Narcan, Catapult and the massage chairs. The PhD. Program is coming to an end in terms of tuition assistance. If people are fully accepted by May 31st, then they are probably still eligible. Graduate tuition assistance is still ongoing, and we are directing them to our website, so they know where to find information. We have green dot training for staff members on a need basis and they can do that in the summertime. In promoting our summer operations hours, we will include that in the Insider as that the main channel for our announcements.
- f. J. Garcia: The presidential position is still open, the next milestone for the committee would be to review applications. Right now, people can apply, and people can be nominated for this position.
- g. Dr. Norris: 18 master's theses have been cleared in COAS
