Executive Council Meeting April 14th, 2025

I. Rec Sports Presentation - R. Garza

- a. TAMIU Rec Sports discussed what they do: Recreational sports at TAMIU provides programming and services tailored to the entire campus community. Our objective is to cultivate an environment where students can thrive academically and personally. We provide opportunities for staff, faculty, and the TAMIU community.
- b. We create opportunities for experiential learning for our students. We hire between 85-95 student employees. They serve as a professional training ground for our employees. There are many things they learn like conflict resolution, customer service, among many others. We want to provide a positive college experience and prepare them for post graduate success
- c. The services we provide include recreation center operations, fitness programming, and intramural sports. We also have personal training, outdoor adventures, and esports. We oversee the tennis complex operations, healthy U, and internships (KINE and communications/marketing)

II. University Update - J. Castillo

- a. Thank you to everybody that was able to join us for the unveiling of the memorial portrait of President Arenaz. The family was happy. The portrait is now facing the Colonnade. It will be there through the Celebration of Life, which is on May 21st. We will take it to the recital hall to be displayed there that evening, and then eventually it will make its way into the Hall of Presidents, which will be the Entry to the Great Room.
- b. Brief on the Legislative Session: Institutional enhancement (its 8 million for us) has still not been restored. It is approximately 423 million across higher education. They want to create a new performance-based funding model with the 423 million but there is not a model in mind. Thus, there is still a lot of uncertainty.
- c. There is no new money in the formulas yet, this is what our primary source of funding is. It comes from SCH production. They never fully fund the formula, but there is no new money in it yet.
- d. The Health Science Research Center and the expansion of the Western Hemispheric Trade Center is coming along nicely and will be fully constructed as designed.
- e. This week on Wednesday we have our Release the Quacken 2025 at 11:00am at the Acequia Fountain.
- f. On April 17th there is an open forum for the final candidate. This is for the Dean of the COHNS position [1:30pm in AIC 126]
- g. The chancellor has granted early release at noon this Friday.

III. Enrollment Update - J.G. Garcia

- a. Please see the enrollment report attached.
- b. The Release the Quacken Event is tied to enrollment for the spring semester. The final number is 8,254 students. That is the first time we hit 8000 students in the spring semester. I want to thank everybody advisors, faculty and everyone that plays a role in this.

- c. The attachment shows the first comparison -the 6th day of registration from the fall of 25 versus the fall 24 and the summer. This is the normal increase; we may not finish with this amount of increase.
- d. Finals are around the corner, if you need help from the testing center, please contact the testing center
- e. Castillo: It is our 55th anniversary this fall and we are optimistic we can hit 9000 students.

IV. Athletic Update - G. Zimmerman

- a. Please see attachments. Softball was on the road with Oklahoma Christian and Cameron this past weekend. They are still in the conference playoffs. Softball and Baseball is highly competitive. This week we have games on Wednesday and Friday. Wednesday the 16th we have Texas Women's University coming in for a double header and Friday we have UT Tyler; and on that Friday the 18th, we have Senior Day. This is our last home weekend for games, we are on the road the very last weekend of the season. Just to give you an example of how competitive it is- St. Edwards is #3 in the conference, in the top 25 in the nation. We scored 43 runs in 4 games and lost 3 of the 4 games. I am proud of what the teams are doing in Softball and Baseball.
- b. The games for Baseball are Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Saturday is Senior Day for the baseball team.
- c. Men and Women's Golf wrapped up their non-conference season. Women's golf continues to do extremely well. They were sitting at #11 in the regional. Men had some losses. They have their conference championships today and tomorrow for the Lonestar Conference championships.
- d. A week from tomorrow is our next staff meeting, they are open, and you are all welcome.
- e. Two weeks from tonight is our Awards Banquet, please rsvp by this Friday. Casino night is the theme, and it will be in the gym.

V. Other Updates:

- a. Castillo: One correction: the commencement rehearsals will be on May 14th not May 13th.
- b. Rosalinda Garcia: SGA is having its elections and today is Conrad's last day, I wanted to thank him for the work he has done with us. We will be signing an MOU with LC. We started inviting LC students to our Big Event and Make a Difference Day and there is increased engagement with our students. We will meet with LC and sign the MOU which says both schools will be collaborating on these big volunteer opportunities. Also, Rec Sports has an amazing Instagram, and I encourage you to follow them. We may also be looking for a graduate intern to work at the tennis facility this summer.
- c. Gill: For faculty senate, we will be holding elections on May 2nd, we are planning to discuss the revised Study Abroad Guidelines as well as the possible creation of an international studies committee. We will also vote on Distinguished Scholar of the Year, Distinguished Teacher of the Year, and Outstanding Teacher of the Year.
- d. Mayra Hernandez: We [staff senate] solidified our partnership with Play Mor. We will have a Bowl a Thon, and it will be the first week of June. It will be set as a standard event. We welcome everyone to attend.
- e. Perez-Batres: Thank you for your support [to Castillo and the provost's office] and to Dr. Gonzalez for their support during the WHTC conference.
- f. Gonzalez: This Wednesday, April 16th, is Undergraduate Research Day. Most colleges are represented. Students will be presenting their student posters. I encourage everyone to take some time to visit this. [It is in WHTC at 3:30pm]

- g. Dr. Tobin: Last fall we had 4 theses in COAS. Right now, we are bracing for 18. I think that is a record. A lot of them are in humanities but scattered across different disciplines.
