Executive Council Minutes

Monday April 28th, 2025

- I. Director of Disability Services, Elizabeth Vasquez
 - a. The office of Disability Services discussed the eligibility process for disability services. Please see PPT attached.
 - b. The disability services staff asks faculty to guide students to their office.
- II. University Update- Juan Castillo
 - a. Starting in the fall we will have 7:00 am time blocks. We are hoping to pilot ten classes. Discussion was had about the reason for this time block: people may want to come back to TAMIU to finish a degree, people may want to take classes in the morning and work in the evening, or for labs that could possibly meet earlier etc.
 - b. We thank Conrad for his service [as the president of the Student Government Association]. Alberto Gonzalez was inducted as the new SGA president for next year. Conrad is still a student here. Please thank him for his service.
 - c. We do not have early voting on campus, but we do have voting on election day, which is May 3rd. This is for the bond referendum. Please go out and vote.
 - d. We will be going to Laredo College on Wednesday to sign an MOA with them for their participation in our Big Event and Make a Difference Day. We will also be discussing transfer pathways that we can make so we have smoother transition for students.
- III. Enrollment Update- Juan Garcia
 - a. A positive trend continues for both semesters. We have three weeks to try and get as many students registered before the summer classes.
 - b. Registration at high schools is going well.
 - c. We have sent the extended hours for the testing center for finals.
- IV. Other Updates:
 - a. J. Castillo tonight we have Student Athlete Casino Night and Awards Banquet in the Gym
 - b. Griz Zimmerman: Tomorrow is our staff meeting. Please see attached.
 - c. Castillo: We have the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals on campus tomorrow and they will be hearing oral arguments on two cases. If your schedule permits, it will be in the recital hall at 9am. The first one about questions surrounding a murder case and a second one around an election fraud case at 10 am.

- d. Ari Gonzalez: The SACSCOC committee chair, Dr. Anderson, has sent the review for the errors of fact titles, names, programs etc. I will review this report and send it back with track changes to leads, and they will send it to me, and then I will send it to Dr. Anderson. It includes the QEP, 14 standards, their overview of RELLIS, and the recommendations that they have for us. This is not the final report. Also, we have a communications student at RELLIS from our program at TAMIU that will be the student speaker for commencement on May 9th.
- e. Roseanne Palacios: Tomorrow, we have the Trailblazer Legacy Night, which is the ceremony when we take the rings to the tower overnight where they are guarded. The following evening, the students come with family to receive their ring; it's a very nice celebration. The Celebration of Life is May 21st.
- f. Rosalinda Garcia: We have a lot of celebration events for our students. The First Gen cording ceremony and we have a number of events coming up On May 2nd -a small press conference with the Food bank, alumni and the food pantry to acknowledge all the stuff we have done together. There is Narcan training for staff on May 6th if you are interested. We teach how to use it and you can get some Narcan as well.
- g. Puneet Gill: We have our May 2nd Faculty Senate meeting coming up. The COED rubric is on the agenda. We are voting on that, and we are voting on the Awards [OTY, DSY and DTY], and the New Study Abroad Guidelines and Study Abroad Committee.
- h. Mayra Hernandez: Our Staff Senate Meeting is May 20th. We have the Bowl-a-Thon confirmed for June 5th. There can be 5 players per team and its \$10 per player. We will provide extra items to engage faculty members. This is for employee engagement -so they can connect outside of the work environment. It's at Playmor and we will add more incentives to have more people attend and participate to cheer their teams. It is \$50 per team, and from 6pm-9 pm with pizza and soft drinks. Elections are coming up for Staff Senate so if any staff members are interested, we will open nominations in the month of May or early June. We will embed the minutes into the agenda so they can keep posted.
- i. Colleen Harris: TexShare is a consortium we participate in; we pay a membership fee (25K) to access a number of databases at a steep discount of retail cost. Due to cuts in IMLS funding, TexShare will need to cut some databases. We don't yet know which databases will be cut, but we will alert campus which databases we do lose. A message to campus about this pending decision is forthcoming. Also, an update on library searches: we are working on getting the Provost the longlists for the two searches where applications close this week, and will run our three remaining searches this summer.
- j. James O'meara: The final meeting for the Dean of Nursing search was on Tuesday and the recommendations were sent to Dr. San Miguel.
- k. Castillo: We had the University Life Awards on Saturday and I want to recognize two folks: Luis Stagg, the Director of Housing and Residential Life, was named Administrator of the Year. Please congratulate him.

Kameron Jorgensen was named Advisor of the Year. Please congratulate her.

I. Steve Harmon: The release the [Quacken] campaign generated around 900,000 views and put our social media users to 1.1 million social media users during the campaign period. It gives us reach and relevance. It also gives us a milestone of 45,000 followers on Facebook, and we are 100 followers shy of 14000 followers on Instagram.

Eligibility Process

- Be enrolled student
- Complete the application through AIM
- Be a person with a disability, as defined by federal law, and self-identify as a student with a disability.





Eligibility Process Cont.

- Present appropriate documentation
- Meet with Disability Services Coordinator
- If requirements met, the Faculty Notification Letters (FNLs) will be provided
- Students can apply for accommodations throughout the semester





Higher Education Services

- Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- Students are responsible for disclosing their disability to the DSS office
- Students must provide documentation of disability and how the disability negatively affects academic functioning





Accommodations Offered

- Accommodations include but are not limited to:
 - Accessible furniture in the classroom
 - Assistance in recruiting note-takers
 - Assistance in ordering audiobooks
 - Assistive listening devices made available
 - Equipment loans (e.g. audio recorders)
 - Print enlargements (large print)
 - Sign Language interpreters
 - Exam accommodations (extended time and alternative location)
