III. Treasurer's report: \$1,646.00

IV. Speaker/Presentation:

- Ph.D. in Criminal Justice: Dr. Sean Maddan
 - The proposal for the Ph.D. program has been in progress for about a decade.
 - The program is a four year structure.
 - Students will be required to take 49 credit hours, about three classes per semester for the first two years.
 - The program follows a hybrid model. The first semester will be FTF.
 - There will be a variety of classes.
 - The first semester will include a pro-seminar course. Focused on establishing professional connections between faculty and students, and discussion about published works by faculty.
 - Theory, Research Methods, and Statistics will also be offered during the first semester.
 - After the first semester, the program will be completely online and synchronous.
 - Other classes will include: Immigration and Crime, Human Trafficking, Mapping, Homeland Security, Cyber Crime, Terrorism, Teaching, etc.

- Students will have the opportunity to teach.
- After coursework, there will be 2-years of intensive research, based on their career path.
- The third year will be focused on their Research Portfolio. The focus will be on students working towards two publishable works or collaborated publications with faculty.
- Dissertation will encompass the student's research. The student's research will be chaired by a faculty committee.
- Students will be funded to attend research conferences.
- Research assistantships, tuition assistance, adjunct teaching will be options for Graduate school funding for admitted students.
- The target will be 10 students per cohort.
- Admissions process will require a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice or related social sciences,
 GRE, 2 letters of recommendation from University faculty, writing sample (usually Master's Thesis or capstone type paper), personal statement, Résumé or CV.
- Still in the process of awaiting approval from SACS and Apply Texas.
