c) COVID-19 Testing – Marycarmen Salinas

- Ongoing on campus and the TAMIU community is highly encouraged to sign-up.
- Easy to sign up to schedule an appointment.

Q and A Briefing:

1Q: What type of test is it and how would it be administered?

- Curative lab testing based out of California that is also being utilized by A&M system institutions.
- Whenever a test is done here, it is sent overnight to California.
- It is a PCR test that is non-invasive and not nasal, but a self-collected oral test.
- Observers are present to guide on how to collect specimen.
- It is a guided, step-by-step process and user-friendly.
- Test kits are deposited at end of testing site with turnaround results within 48-72 hours.
- Register with your TAMIU email and results are provided to the registered email.

Q: What if we have a new employee and they cannot register for test? What would they have to do?

- Call Student Health Services at 326-2866 to be guided on how to get registered.
- UIN numbers may not be registered immediately for new hires in the Curative system.

Q: Is the oral test as accurate as nasal test?

- The data is by Curative, and, at this time, we do not have exact number to compare with nasal accuracy due to the tests being oral only.
- Some research has shown nasal to be more accurate than oral; however, the accuracy test provided by Curative for oral testing is 90%.

Q: Can we get tested more than once?

- Yes, and highly encouraged to test as often as possible.
- The test is a snapshot of a person's sample on the specific testing date, but does not represent exposure or infection after the test day.

Q: What is the procedure the day of test administration?

- 20-minutes before appointment do not drink, eat, or brush teeth because it will tamper with the swab sample that could result in a non-testable or invalid test.
- Presenting an ID is required the day of the appointment. Acceptable forms of ID include: passport, TAMIU ID, and state ID.
- The ID will verify who the person is that is being checked-in, along with confirming your registration confirmation code.

• Everyone who registers must make sure to receive a confirmation email. If you do not receive a confirmation, then your registration did not go through, at which point you may need to reregister or contact Student Health Services, if needed.

Q: Is a person able to register and test on the same day?

• Yes, same day registration and testing is available when testing availability is shown on the schedule.

Q: What are the days for testing?

- Every Tuesday and Wednesday from 8:30am-11:30am.
- Monday mornings are reserved for athletes to be eligible to participate in their sport.

Q: Will you be having testing times available in the late afternoons or evening as well?

- Evening testing every other Monday evening from 4:00-6:00pm
- Next evening date is scheduled for Monday, October 19th.

Q: What is the process if an employee does test positive?

- Student Health Services only oversees students who test positive.
- Employees who test positive are required to immediately contact Jan from Human Resources who will provide specific instructions on what to do next.

c) SECC Campaign - Mary Treviño

- This is a state wide campaign for all state agencies.

- Currently, the campaign has raised \$35,275 in pledges from employees. However, last year was over \$53,000.

- Thus far, we are at 177 participants in comparison to 295 participants from last year, and there is still time to participate.
