- **Speaker / Presentation:** Workstation Ergonomics: How to Set up Your Station Properly–Daniel Berndt, Environmental Health & Safety Coordinator II

- **Office chairs** The chair is the foundation of our workstation. This is where most time is spent. From the ground up.
- **Height adjustment** Sit back in your chair, and make sure your feet are flat on the floor. Your knees should be at a 90-degree angle. This would make for a good height adjustment target.
- **Seat height** There might be a lever to adjust the height, or you can gently turn the chair counterclockwise to go up or down.
- **Seat pan** This is the part that does the most work by supporting our bodies and taking the weight off our feet.
- How to adjust the seat pan There is at times a lever on the left side of the seat that you can depress that will then allow the seat to move forwards and backward for proper seat dept. There might also be a bar at the front of the seat under the chair that will allow you to make this adjustment as well.
- **Depth adjustment** You will want a space of two or three fingers between the back of your knee and the front of the chair.
- Arm rest Elbows and arms should be relaxed at a 90-degree angle. You don't want to be stretched out too much and you don't want to stress your shoulders or cause discomfort.
- **How to adjust your armrests** There is usually a button on the side of the armrest, that allows for easy movement up and down.
- Backrest of the chair The backrest should be used to help with maintaining a relaxed position. There is the option to lock the back of the chair, but you are still able to move the provided mode, you should be able to relax the back of the chair to offer comfort
- Lumbar Based on your personal needs you can adjust the lumbar support. Some chairs offer the adjustment as a slider on either side of the chair or as a bar on the back of the chair.
  When it comes to adjustments to the chair, sometimes slight little adjustments can make a difference.
