Speaker/Presentation

Or. Arenaz – Welcome back for the school year. Enrollment close to where we were in 2020. Enrollment is up, but credit hours are down from 2020. This semester is the second largest incoming class we've ever had. As we go into the Legislative Session, this Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 is part of Base Year. Encouraged and reminded staff that are applying or have applied for the Master's Program, that the University's covering the cost of Tuition and Fees and all they need to pay for is books. Not certain about what to expect from the Legislative Session. Members of the House Appropriation Committee mentioned the possibility of freezing tuition for the next 2-4 years. He will be going to Austin at the end of the month to meet with the Legislative Budget Board to present that for college to be more affordable the State needs to invest more money into institutions of higher education. We are not funded by PUF/HUB, but through the Higher Education Fund (HEF). We received \$370 million from HEF.

Questions:

Q: Tuition and Fees for employees pursuing Doctorates: Available since Spring Semester?

A: SAP is in available through the HR website, and it needs to be related to your function on campus (related to your job), it's setup by the System. System is billed and pays the other institution.

Q: What are the enrollment goals for the future? Do we plan to increase or maintain our current numbers?

A: We want to reach 10,000 students by 2025, perhaps 2028/2029.

Q: Is it the same for those seeking their first Master's Degree?

A: System is paying tuition and fees to the Institution where the Employee is enrolled.

o Anna Buentello - Review Admission requirements, overview on all the programs TAMIU offers, and the tuition waver for Fall Semester. Offer over 20 programs designed for working professionals: Full-time, part-time, hybrid, fulland sub- terms, and face to face. There are multiple financial assistance options available. Admission requirements: apply at goapplytexas.org; and submit transcripts for all institutions attended (except TAMIU). Programs have difference admission requirements. Visit Grad School page for specific program requirements, tamiu.edu/gradschool. If it has been more than a year, you do have to re-submit your application at the same website. The application fee will be waived. Same procedure regarding transcripts. Re-admission will be based on new catalog policies, program and Graduate School admission requirements, etc. There is a time limitation on coursework. Should your coursework be expired, you will need to repeat your coursework, request a course substitution, and requests a course extension which must be approved by program faculty, department chair, college dean, and graduate school dean. Degrees offered for Master's of Arts are Communication, Counseling Psychology, English, History and Political Thought, Language, Literature, and Translation, and Sociology. Degrees for Master's of Sciences are Biology, Criminal Justice, Mathematics, and Psychology. There is also a Master's of Public Administration and a PhD in Criminal Justice. For ARSSB, there are Business Administration (Criminal Justice, Administration, Int'l Banking and Finance, International Business, Int'l Trade and Logistics, and Management. ARSSB also offers Master's of Professional Accountancy, Master of Science in Information Science, PhD in International Business Administration. The College of Nursing offers a Master's of Science degree in Family Nurse Practitioner and Nursing Administration. The COED offers Master's of Arts in Teaching and Master of Science. Master of Science options are Bilingual Education, Curriculum and Instruction, Educational Administration, School Counseling, and Special Education. In order to get the Tuition and Fee Waiver, employee must have been with TAMIU for 12 months prior to starting program, fully admitted to master's program, remain in good standing, and is limited to 6 hours each session (fall, spring, and summer) up to 9 consecutive sessions. The time limit to complete degree is 3 years. The form must be submitted every semester and signed by supervisor, HR, Graduate School, and the Registrar. Tuition waiver applies to 1st master's degree only. It covers prep module courses (MBA), if needed. However, it doesn't cover undergraduate pre-requisite courses. Books IncludED are NOT covered.

Employees still qualify for financial assistance, both scholarships and student loans. There will be a Graduate School Open House on Thursday, October 13th from 5:30p – 7:30p at ZSC.

Q: Will this be available for Spring 2023?

A: Yes, it begins in Fall 2022, doesn't mean that it's only eligible for Fall 2022.

Q: If we will be here for a year by Fall 2023, can we apply for the program then, even if we start our Masters in Spring 2023.

A: You can apply in Fall 2023 for Spring 2024.

Q: Do you need to keep re-applying for every semester enrolled? A: You don't have to re-apply to the program, but you do have to fill out a form every semester.

Rosanne Palacios – Donors around the world want to know if we've "got skin in the game". We have been up to 64% participation in this campaign. The amount is not important, it's the number of people who give. Would like to be above 65% participation. Use the QR code to donate. At the VivaTAMIU party \$5,000 given out to 2 colleges. Within the department, two \$2,500 prizes. If your department reaches 100% participation, you get \$2,500 to the program you choose. Everyone in that department get a \$5 voucher.

Q: VivaTAMIU party?

A: Yes, VivaTAMIU party is October 5th.

Q: If we're already giving, do we need to re-submit anything for our contributions to continue?

A: No, you do not need to re-submit.
